#### **Parent Opinion Survey**

Thank you to the parents who completed the survey. Overall the results were pleasing, however it has also provided the school with information on areas that need addressing. We did receive comments about supervision before school, saying that there was no supervision during this time. There is always a teacher on duty in the playground from 8.45am in the morning. All classroom teachers are in their classrooms from this time so that students can enter their classrooms to ensure they are ready to start the day at 9.00am. Specialist teachers do the before school supervision at this time and there is only one teacher on duty. This teacher roams between the front of the school and the oval. Teachers do not technically commence duty until this time in the morning and cannot be required to do duty before this time. This is why we strongly discourage students from being dropped off early in the morning. Mornings are also busy times for myself and Mr Warne with parent concerns often being brought to our attention at this time and also, dealing with staff and organisational matters along with the focus of our work, our students.

Thank you to the families who assisted with this on Tuesday afternoon and Zoe Light for her organisation. The school is looking much better with the removal of weeds etc and fresh mulch on some of the garden beds.



#### **Cyber Safety**


